Related facts:



- A new Union Council of Ministers was formed on 31st May, 2019 after the landslide victory for the BJP led NDA in the 17th General Election allowing them to form the 2nd consecutive NDA government.
- The swearing in ceremony took place on 30th May, 2019 in the Rashtrapati Bhawan where Narendra Modi took oath as the Prime Minister of India along with other ministers of the cabinet.
- A total of 57 people took oath as Ministers in which 24 people took oath as the Cabinet Minister, 24 as Minister of State and 9 as Minister of State (Independent Charge).
- It is worth to state that Article 75(1) in The Constitution of India 1949 provisions that the Prime Minister shall be appointed by the President and the other Ministers shall be appointed by the President on the advice of the Prime Minister.

Key facts about Ministers:

- The new Cabinet, which comprises of 58 ministers, has a total six (11%) women ministers in the Cabinet.
- First-time ministers Amit Shah and S. Jaishankar bagged the key Home and External Affairs portfolios respectively.
- Nirmala Sitharaman became the first woman full-time Finance Minister.
- A new Ministry called Jal Shakti has been created. It will be headed by Gajendra Singh Shekawat.

Related facts:

- On 30th May, 2019, Narendra Modi, leader of National Democratic Alliance sworn in as the Prime Minister of India for the second consecutive term.
- President Ramnath Kovind administered the Oath of Office and Secrecy to Narendra Modi in the Rashtrapati Bhawan.
- Besides 24 Cabinet ministers, 9 were sworn in as Minister of State with Independent charge and another 24 as Minister of State.
- The function was attended by leaders from BIMSTEC countries (Bangladesh, Myanmar, Sri Lanka, Thailand, Bhutan and Nepal including India) and foreign envoys, Governors, Chief Ministers, Opposition leaders, corporate heads and film stars.
- In 2014, heads of SAARC countries were invited in the swearing-in ceremony.
- On 23rd May, 2019, the Election Commission of India declared election results of 542 Lok Sabha constituencies held in seven phases (one constituency Vellore, Tamil Nadu election was postponed) in the country.
- The number of seats won by seven **National Parties** are as follows:

(i) Bharatiya Janata Party- 303

(ii) Indian National Congress – 52

(iii) All India Trinamool Congress- 22

(iv) Bahujan Samaj Party – 10

(v) Nationalist Congress Party – 05

(vi) Communist Party of India- 02

(vii) Communist Party of India (Marxist) – 03

- While some of the major **Regional Parties** such as the Biju Janata Dal won 12 seats, Shiv Sena got 18 seats, Lok Jan Shakti Party secured 6 seats and Yuva Jana Sramika Rythu Congress Party bagged 22 seats.



- In this election, the **National Democratic Alliance** (NDA) bagged 353 seats; **United Progressive Alliance** (UPA) got 92 while **Others** hold 97 seats.
- In Uttar Pradesh, out of total 80 seats, Bharatiya Janata Party with its ally Apna Dal bagged 64 seats, Bahujan Samaj Party got 10 seats, Samajwadi Party won 5 seats while Indian National Congress secured 1 seat.
- 17th Lok Sabha will see representation of highest ever 78 women MPs. Most 11 women MPs were elected each from Uttar Pradesh and West Bengal.
- **Chandrani Murmu** (25 years, 11 months and eight days old) became the youngest woman member in the Lok Sabha history. She was elected to the Lower House from the **Keonjhar** Lok Sabha constituency of Odisha.

Chief Minister of Arunachal Pradesh

Related facts:

- The first BJP government in the state of Arunachal Pradesh with absolute majority took oath on May 29, 2019.
- BJP leader and former CM Pema Khandu took oath as the Chief Minister of Arunachal Pradesh at the Dorjee Khandu state convention hall in Itanagar.
- BJP had won an impressive 41 seats in the 60-seat house in the Assembly elections creating history. The council of Minister also took oath in the ceremony.
- Pema Khandu will now be having his second term as the Chief Minister of Arunachal Pradesh.
- The oath was administered by Governor Dr. BD Mishra.
- On May 27, Mr. Khandu was elected unanimously as the leader of the BJP legislature party at its meeting held in Itanagar.



Arunachal Pradesh state election:

- Assembly elections in Arunachal Pradesh were held for 57 seats of total 60 seats. This happened as three BJP candidates were declared elected unopposed prior of election.
- BJP won 41 seats out of 60, Janata Dal (United) won 7 seats, National People's Party (NPP) won 5, Congress 4, People's Party of Arunachal (PPA) 1 and Independents 2.

Related facts:

- Sikkim Assembly Election took place along with the 17th General Election.
- Voting for 1 Lok Sabha and all the 32 assembly seats took place on April 1 2019.
- Result of the election was declared on May 23, 2019.



Highlights of the result:

- The term of the Sikkim state assembly ended on May 27, 2019.
- Of the total 32 seats, Sikkim Krantikari Morcha won 17 seats, exactly the number required for majority.
- Chief Minister Pawan Chamling led Sikkim Democratic Front (SKF) won 15 seats.
- The SDF got a total of 47.63 % votes and ended up winning 15 seats, while the SKM, which won most 17 seats, secured only 47.03 % votes.
- Prem Singh Tamang alias P.S. Golay became the new Chief Minister of Sikkim.
- He took the oath for the Chief Minister on May 27, 2019 in Gangtok.
- He had earlier served as the Minister for Animal Husbandry, Ecclesiastical and Industry Department from 1994- 99 in Chamling government.
- He founded the SKF after breaking the ties with SDF in 2013.
- Pawan Kumar Chamling has been the country's longest-serving Chief Minister till date having five successive terms.
- He had ruled Sikkim for 24 years assuming the charge for the first time in 1993.

Related facts:

- On 11 April 2019, Andhra Pradesh Legislative Assembly Elections were held alongside the General Election for constituting the fifteenth Legislative Assembly in the state.
- Results were declared on May 23, 2019.
- Y.S. Jagan Mohan Reddy led Yuva Jana Sramika Rythu Congress Party (YSR Congress) won legislative assembly elections, with a massive mandate.
- YSR Congress Party swept the poll winning a record 151 seats out of 175 seats, securing almost 86% of the Andhra Pradesh Legislative Assembly.
- Whereas, former Chief Minister N. Chandrababu Naidu led Telugu Desam Party maintained to secure only 23 seats in the legislative elections.
- Pawan Kalyan's Janasena Party got 1 seat.
- YSR Congress Party (YSRCP) also won 22 out of 25 Lok Sabha seats.
- On 30 May 2019, Yeduguri Sandinti Jaganmohan Reddy, founder of YSR Congress Party sworn in as the Chief Minister of Andhra Pradesh at the Indira Gandhi Municipal Stadium in Vijayawada.
- He became the second Chief Minister of Andhra Pradesh after state bifurcation in 2014.
- He has been elected as Member of Legislative Assembly from Pulivendla constituency.
- Jaganmohan Reddy is the son of the former Chief Minister of Andhra Pradesh, Y. S. Rajasekhara Reddy.
- Prior to this, he was Leader of opposition in the Andhra Pradesh Legislative Assembly from 16 May 2014 until 23 May 2019.
- On 8 June 2019, Governor ESL Narasimhan administered the oath of office and secrecy to the 25 new ministers constituting the state cabinet at a ceremony held near State Secretariat at Velagapudi.
- Apart from Chief Minister, there will be five Deputy Chief Minister, one each from Scheduled Caste, Scheduled Tribe, backward, minority and Kapu communities as announced by incumbent CM Y S Jaganmohan Reddy.

Question: Navin Patnaik took oath as the Chief Minister of Odisha on May 29, 2019.



Related facts:

- Biju Janta Dal (BJD) supremo Naveen Patnaik sworn in as Odisha Chief Minister for the fifth time in a row at the Exhibition Ground in Bhubaneswar on May 29, 2019.



- Odisha Governor Prof. Ganeshi Lal administered the oath of office and secrecy to Mr. Patnaik and his twenty councils of ministers.
- A huge gathering of dignitaries including captains of industries, women SHG leaders, and party workers attend the swearing-in ceremony.
- The Council of Minister included eleven cabinet ministers and nine ministers of state.

Odisha state assembly election:

- Odisha witnessed the legislative assembly election along with the 17th General elections. Results were declared on May 23 2019.
- Polling was held for 146 constituencies of the 147-member Odisha Legislative Assembly.
- Election to Patkura assembly constituency in Kendrapara district was countermanded and postponed after the death of the BJD candidate.
- Ruling Biju Janta Dal won a whopping 112 seats. BJP managed to win 23 seats becoming the major opposition party while Congress won just 9 seats. Others won 3 seats.

Navin Patnaik:

- Navin Patnaik is the supreme leader of BJD and son of former CM of Odisha Biju Patnaik.
- Patnaik was sworn in as the Chief Minister for the first time on March 5, 2000. BJD came to power in alliance with the Bharatiya Janata Party.
- He continued his second term from 2004 to 2009 when the BJD fighting the polls in alliance with the Communist Party of India, the Communist Party of India (Marxist) and the Nationalist Congress Party.
- BJD won the 2009 and 2014 assembly elections without any alliance and he again became the Chief Minister.

Invitee in the swearing in ceremony of PM Modi

Question: Leaders of which regional organization are invited in the swearing in ceremony of Prime Minister Narendra Modi scheduled on May 30, 2019?

Related facts:

- India has invited leaders of BIMSTEC member countries to attend the swearing-in of Prime Minister Narendra Modi and his council of ministers on May 30, 2019.
- In 2014, India invited leaders of SAARC member countries, including Pakistan, to the swearing-in ceremony of the PM. This time however, India did not send any invitation to the Pakistani counterpart.
- The oath taking ceremony will take place at Rashtrapati Bhawan from 7 pm.
- A record 6,500 guests are likely to attend the swearing-in ceremony.
- India has also invited the president of Kyrgyzstan and prime minister of Mauritius for the ceremony.
- The invitees are recognized with the focus on its 'Neighbourhood First' policy.
- The President of the Kyrgyz Republic currently chairs of the Shanghai Cooperation Organization, and the Prime Minister of Mauritius has earlier been the chief guest at this year's Pravasi Bhartiya Divas.



- PM Modi will visit Bishkek, the capital of Kyrgyzstan to attend the Shanghai Cooperation Organisation Summit in June.

BIMSTEC & its relevance:

- BIMSTEC, or Bay of Bengal Initiative for Multi-Sectoral Technical and Economic Cooperation, is a grouping comprising Bangladesh, India, Myanmar, Sri Lanka, Thailand, Nepal and Bhutan.
- SAARC has nearly been defunct in the last few years after India, and several other members, pulled out of the SAARC Summit that was to be held in Islamabad in 2016.
- No SAARC Summit since the one in Kathmandu in November 2014 took place. This has increased the relevance of BIMSTEC in the recent times for the neighborhood relation of India.
- India has sought to strengthen the BIMSTEC grouping since then as a substitute to SAARC.
- When India hosted the BRICS Summit in Goa in September 2016, it also invited BIMSTEC leaders for the BRICS regional outreach.

- An AQI between **0 & 50** is considered **good**, **51 and 100** **satisfactory**, **101 and 200** **moderate**, **201 and 300** **poor**, **301 and 400** **very poor**, and **401 and 500** **severe**, as per **pollution control authorities**.

 - South state **Tamil Nadu** is emerging as a major '**client**' of the bank. "
 - ADB will lend **500 million dollar** each for **energy projects, and urban projects**, apart from the **Chennai Metro Phase II**.

- The Amicus Curiae Committee was setup by the High Court of Kerala to assist it in the large quantity of case related to Kerala flood.
- The 49-page report was submitted by the Amicus Curiae Advocate Jacob P Alex to the High Court.
- **Following are the recommendations and facts given in the report:**
- The excessive rainfall that had not been anticipated was the major cause of floods in Kerala.
- Above normal rainfall, more than 42%, during June-August 2018, and extremely heavy rainfall on August 15-17, 2018 caused unprecedented floods resulting in massive loss of life and property across Kerala.
- None of the 79 dams in Kerala were operated or used for the purpose of flood control/moderation. They are managed for irrigation and power generation purpose.
- No effective flood control zone is maintained; high reservoir storage even in the first week of August; sudden release of water from all dams; reduced reservoir storage capacity due to siltation.
- No integrated operation of dams based on scientifically identified Rule Curves, absence of proper Flood Warning etc is some of them.
- The report also recommended appointing an independent expert committee headed by a former judge of the Supreme Court and preferably consisting of a reputed hydrologist, experts in dam management, engineers and other experts for a more detailed study.
- Kerala flood took place in the month of August, 2018 which led to the death of around 480 people and property damage of around 5.6 billion USD.
- It was the worst flood of the century in the history of Kerala state.

- Cumulative Crude oil production during April-February, 2018-19 was 31348.98 TMT which is 7.06% and 3.96% lower than the cumulative target and production respectively during the corresponding period of last year.
- Company wise production during February, 2019:
- ONGC—1598.79 TMT; OIL—243.68 TMT; PSC Fields 721.25 TMT

Natural Gas:

- Natural Gas production during February, 2019 was 2565.75 MMSCM which is 3.29% higher when compared with February, 2018 although 8.71% lower than the target for the month.
- Cumulative natural gas production during April-February, 2018-19 was 30057.41 MMSCM which is marginally higher by 0.64% when compared with the production during corresponding period of last year, but is lower by 7.53% than target for the period.

- India's flagship programme, National Mission for Clean Ganga or Namami Gange was felicitated with Public Water Agency of the Year award on 9th April, 2019 at the Global Water Summit.
- The Global Water Awards recognise excellence across the entire international water industry and reward those initiatives in the water, wastewater, and desalination sectors which bring remarkable improvements in the lives of people.
- These awards are presented by the Global Water Intelligence at the Global Water Summit. It is the major business conference for the water industry worldwide.



Namami Gange Mission:

- The Namami Gange programme is an integrated mission for cleaning the sacred river Ganga.
- This project adopts multi-sectoral intervention with multi-stakeholder involvement as well as a basin based approach which includes Ganga and its tributaries.
- It aims to provide comprehensive and sustainable solutions for major pollution hot spots along the stretch of 97 towns and 4,465 villages on the Ganga stem.
- This mission is constructing new infrastructures for sewage treatment alongwith rehabilitating the old and disfunctioning Sewage Treatment Plant (STPs) as well as ensuring Operation and Maintenance (O & M) of all assets hence created.

Work done under the Mission:

- Under the project, a total of 289 projects have so far been sanctioned at a cost of Rs 28,377 crore out of which 87 projects have been completed.
- 151 sewerage projects, 112 on the main stem of the Ganga and 39 projects on the tributaries, at a sanctioned cost of Rs 23,158.93 crore has been approved for the creation of 3,732 million liters per day (MLD), new Sewage Treatment Plant (STP) capacity, 1114 MLD rehabilitated STP capacity and laying approximately 4971.01 km sewerage networks.
- A total of 37 projects of pollution abatement have been completed till date which has resulted in laying 2,565 km sewer networks and of 575 MLD of STP capacities in the Ganga basin.
- 63 projects are under execution and 51 are under various stages of tendering. 35 projects are expected to be completed in 2019 and 65 by 2020.
- 10 cities including Haridwar, Kanpur, Varanasi, Prayagraj and Kolkata which contribute more than 64 per cent of the pollution in Ganga. They have been covered comprehensively in all aspects under the Mission.
- Kanpur has been the hotspot of major pollution on the Ganga stem. A 20 MLD Common Effluent Treatment Plant (CETP) at Jajmau with an estimated cost of Rs. 617 Cr. has been sanctioned to address the challenge of industrial pollution in Kanpur.

- Honeypots are decoy systems providing hosts that have no authorized users other than the honeypot administrators, as they serve no business function.
- A honeypot is a system intended to mimic likely targets of cyber attackers for security researchers to monitor cybercriminal behavior.
- Honeypots are used to trap attackers into thinking that they have penetrated a network, allowing time for defenders to analyze their threat parameters and generate appropriate threat indicators to block an impending attack.

- The NITI Aayog and the Rocky Mountain Institute (RMI) released a report titled India's Electric Mobility Transformation: Progress to Date and Future Opportunities on opportunities for the automobile sector and government under the Faster Adoption and Manufacturing of Electric Vehicles II (FAME II) scheme.
- The report titled, quantifies the direct oil and carbon savings that the vehicles incentivized under FAME II will deliver. RMI is an Indian and global nonprofit organization focused on driving the efficient and restorative use of resources.
- The report also quantifies the catalytic effect that FAME II and other measures could have on the overall Electric Vehicle (EV) market.
- If FAME II and other measures – in public and private space – are successful, India could realize EV sales penetration of 30% of private cars, 70% of commercial cars, 40% of buses and 80% of two and three-wheelers by 2030.
- Achieving these levels of market share by 2030 could generate cumulative savings of 846million tonnes of CO2 over the total deployed vehicles' lifetime.
- The FAME II scheme, which was notified by the Union Cabinet in February 2019, aims to further accelerate the government of India's commitment to a clean mobility future, sees the electrification of transportation as a primary focus area.
- FAME II intends to catalyze the market for faster adoption of EVs to ensure durable economic growth and global competitiveness for India's automotive industry.

Key highlights from the report:

- Effects of FAME II will go beyond the vehicles that are eligible under the FAME II.
- There is considerable energy and CO2 savings associated with the two, three, and four-wheeled vehicles and buses covered by FAME II over their lifetime, as well as the potential savings associated with greater adoption levels by 2030.
- The electric buses covered under FAME II will account for 3.8 billion vehicle kilometers travelled over their lifetime.
- In order to capture the potential opportunity in 2030, batteries must remain a key focal point as they will continue to be the key cost driver of EVs.
- Vehicles eligible under FAME II scheme can cumulatively save 5.4 million tonnes of oil equivalent over their lifetime worth Rs 17.2 thousand crores.
- EVs sold through 2030 could cumulatively save 474 million tonnes of oil equivalent (Mtoe) worth INR 15 lakh crore and generate net CO2 savings of 846 million tonnes over their operational lifetime.
- The auto and battery industries could collaborate to enhance customer awareness, promote domestic manufacturing, promote new business models, conduct R&D for EVs and components, and consider new business models to promote EVs.
- Government should focus on a phased manufacturing plan to promote EVs, provide fiscal and non-fiscal incentives for phased manufacturing of EVs and batteries.
- Different government departments can consider a bouquet of potential policies, such as congestion pricing, ZEV credits, low emission/exclusion zones, parking policies, etc. to drive adoption of EVs.

- The Pilots had undergone their basic Flying training at the 'Helicopter Training School' at Air Force Station Hakimpet followed by advanced training at Air Force Station Yelahanka.
- The helicopter was certified airworthy by Squadron Leader Richa Adhikari the unit Engineering officer. This is yet another achievement of women officers in the IAF.

- The High-Level Committee was constituted to examine the issues relating to the preparation of action plan to create synergy among Research and Development Centres of Oil and Gas Public Sector Undertakings, tax issues and ways to benefit from GST by the Oil and Gas PSUs.
- The committee has also recommended increasing the use of bio mass, essentially surplus agricultural residue, in the production of bio fuels.
- It also looked into merger, acquisition and consolidation of Oil and Gas Public Sector Undertakings and the Joint Ventures.
- It explored the need and possibility of formation of new entity dealing with oil services and supply of qualified manpower to the Oil and Gas sector around the world.
- The Committee, in the process, visited, different Research and Development and training institutes of different oil and gas PSUs.
- Ministry of Petroleum and Natural Gas will consider the recommendations submitted by the Committee while formulating policies.

- It is located in Lake Mansarovar in the remote south-western portion of the Tibet Autonomous Region of China and adjacent districts in the far-western region of Nepal.
- The Kailash Mansarovar is expanded across an area of 6,836 sq km within India which is part of the larger landscape of 31,000 sq km.
- Both China and Nepal have proposed the landscape as a world heritage site to UNESCO.

- Uttarakhand will be benefited if Kailash Mansarovar becomes a permanent part of heritage list being a major transit point of the annual Kailash Mansarovar pilgrimage
- The Indian part of the landscape in the State of Uttarakhand comprises four major watersheds viz. the Panar-Saryu, the Saryu-Ramganga, the Gori-Kali and the Dhauli-Kali.
- UNESCO's current list includes a total of 845 cultural Heritage sites across the world having 29 from India.

- While the designation of a country as a currency manipulator does not immediately attract any penalties, it tends to decrease the confidence about a country in the global financial markets.

Criteria of listing:

- Countries with a current-account surplus equivalent to 2 per cent of gross-domestic product are eligible for the list which was 3 per cent earlier.

- Other thresholds include repeated intervention in the currency markets and a trade surplus with the US of at least \$20 billion.
- These policies are used by Trump administration to discourage countries hurting American businesses and consumers.
- US is currently facing a trade war with China and has also imposed severe tariffs over Mexico too.
- China's goods trade surplus with US stands at \$419 billion over the four quarters through December 2018.

- Austria's President Alexander Van der Bellen named Vice Chancellor Hartwig Löger as the interim leader. He will serve until the appointment of a new transitional government.
- Kurz was the head of the conservative Austrian People's Party, is the first Chancellor in post-war Austrian history to lose a confidence vote.
- He was the world's youngest state leader, just 31 when elected in 2017.
- While the SPÖ control only 52 of the 183-seat lower house, the FPÖ – which holds 51 seats – also backed the motions, which needed only a simple majority to pass.

Video scandal:

- The video sting has widely been labelled “Ibiza-gate”, after the Spanish island where the footage was recorded.
- It was secretly filmed in July 2017 in which Kurz was seen promising niece of a Russian oligarch for tenders and public contracts in return of donations and political support to his party. It was released by German media.

- Jallianwala Bagh is a garden located in Amritsar close to Golden Temple.
- British administration passed various repressive acts including Rowlatt Act, 1919 which allowed arresting any person for two year on the basis of suspicion without any trial. A protest took place nationwide led by Mahatma Gandhi.
- In Amritsar the news that prominent Indian leaders had been arrested and banished from that city sparked violent protests on 10th April, 1919.

- The task of restoring order was given to Brig. Gen. Reginald Edward Harry Dyer . Among the measures taken was a ban on public gatherings.
- On 13th April, 1919, the day of Baishakhi, around 10,000 unarmed people gathered at Jallianwala Bagh to condemn the arrest and deportation of two national leaders from Punjab, Satya Pal and Saifuddin Kitchlew and to celebrate Baishakhi.
- Dyer and his soldiers arrived and sealed off the exit and opened fire on the crowd without warning.
- Hundreds rounds of shooting took place until they ran out of ammunition.
- Official British record mentions death of 379 people whereas Indian officials claimed the death to be around 1,000 people and more than hundreds of people were injured.
- The shooting was followed by the proclamation of martial law in the Punjab that included public floggings and other humiliations.

- As the legislative branch of the Israeli government, the Knesset passes all laws, elects the President and Prime Minister (although the latter is ceremonially appointed by the President), approves the cabinet, and supervises the work of the government.

- The Meeting desired to impart impetus to ASEAN-India Connectivity, in all its forms. It also welcomed the commissioning of the ERIA Study on the Trilateral Highway and its extension to Lao PDR, Cambodia and Vietnam as well as the proposal on formation of Digital Villages in the ASEAN countries, under digital connectivity.
- The Meeting decided to impart urgency to Cooperation in Renewable Energy and hold an ASEAN-India Conference on Renewable Energy in 2019. The Energy and Resources Institute (TERI) and ASEAN Centre for Energy (ACE) would be the co-partners for this project.
- The ASEAN-India partnership is being implemented through the Plan of Action (2016-20) to implement the ASEAN-India Partnership for Peace, Progress and Shared Prosperity.

- Under this scheme, the first group of 6,800 investors hailing from over 70 countries with investments totalling 100 billion dirhams (USD 27 billion) was being given permanent residency.
- The Golden Card offers great benefits to the cardholders and their families as well as creating an attractive environment for business and growth.
- The new initiative will bring large amount of foreign investment and fuel the local economy making it more efficient and attractive for investors furthering the competitiveness of the market.
- The permanent residency benefits also include the spouse and children of the cardholder.
- Expatriates in the UAE are usually given limited duration residence permits under a sponsorship system.
- The “Golden Card” visa categories include general investors who will be granted a 10-year visa, real estate investors, who can get a visa for five years, along with entrepreneurs and talented professionals such as doctors, researchers and innovators 10 years.
- The fifth category; outstanding students will also be permitted residency visas for five years. All categories of visas can be renewed upon expiry.
- The Indian emigrant community is the largest ethnic community in the UAE. It contributes to roughly about 30 per cent of the country’s population of around nine million.
- Though most of the Indians living in the UAE are employed, about 10 per cent of the Indian population constitutes dependent family members.

India's stand:

- **India** has continuously boycotted the **One Belt One Road** initiative of China since it has been showcased to the world.

- India did not attend the event in protest against the project of **China-Pakistan Economic Corridor (CPEC)**.
- CPEC is the most **important project** aimed by OBOR which goes for **developing infrastructure and routes via Pakistan**.
- India's opposition comes due to the project blueprint **covering the Pakistan occupied Kashmir in its route of development**.
- India has accused Pakistan for disturbing its **sovereignty**.

South Asia project:

- **South Asia** is covered by three major undertakings – the **China-Myanmar Economic Corridor (CMEC)**, the **Nepal-China Trans-Himalayan Multi-dimensional Connectivity Network**, including **Nepal-China cross-border railway**, as well as the **China Pakistan Economic Corridor (CPEC)**.

BCIM:

- **BCIM** corridor has total route coverage of **2800 km**.

 - State wise, Odisha tops the total reserves/resources with 44% share followed by Karnataka 22%, Madhya Pradesh 12%, Maharashtra and Goa 7% each, Andhra Pradesh 4% and Jharkhand 2%.
 - Rajasthan, Gujarat, Telangana and West Bengal together shared the remaining about 2% resources.

- Imports from the four Asian countries also climbed as they diverted supply into India.
- Imports of value-added steel, primarily for the auto sector and high-end electrical steel were the biggest source of imports.

- The earlier decline in the business sentiments were down due to the banking fraud and its impact continue to unfold, and the tightening actions on LoUs (letter of undertaking) and LoCs (Letter of Credit) have led to reduced liquidity. Also, there is an apprehension of tighter regulatory and lending norms.
- The jump in the sentiments the second quarter compared to the first quarter this year however was mainly due easing of liquidity and foreign investors warming up to India.

- A contract was signed in 2016 and the first overhaul started in November 2017. The overhauled aircraft made its first test flight in October 2018.

China develops world's first armed amphibious drone boat Marine Lizard

Question: Marine lizard is developed by which country?

Related facts:

- China has successfully tested the world's first armed amphibious drone boat which could be used in land assault operations and it is capable of forming a combat triad with aerial drones and other drone ships.
- It is built by Wuchang Shipbuilding Industry Group under China Shipbuilding Industry Corporation (CSIC), the drone ship, named Marine Lizard, successfully passed delivery checks and left factory on 8th April, 2019.



Marine Lizard:

- It has maximum operation range of 1,200 kms, and can be remotely controlled via satellites.
- The 12-meter-long Marine Lizard is a trimaran propelled by a diesel-powered hydrojet and can reach a maximum speed of 50 knots while maintaining stealth.
- On approaching land, the amphibious drone ship can release four continuous track units hidden under its belly, and travel at 20 kms an hour on land.
- With about USD 178 billion defence budget, the two million strong Chinese military, the world's largest, has been focusing on developing a range of new weapons in recent years.
- The Marine Lizard's payloads include an electro-optical system and a radar system. In the weapon department, it is equipped with two machine guns and a vertical launching system for anti-ship and anti-aircraft missiles.
- It can autonomously sail, avoid obstacles and plan routes.
- This amphibious drone is suitable for island assault operations as a swarm of such drone ships could lead an attack following a first wave of artillery and air strikes. The drone boat is also a great choice for coastal defence. The boat can remain dormant on an uninhabited island for up to eight months.
- Guided by China's BeiDou Navigation Satellite System, the Marine Lizard can cooperate with other battle units in an integrated command system.

- The ships would patrol along the International Maritime Boundary Line (IMBL) between the two countries covering a distance of approximately 725 Kms over a period of four days.
- The ships will also undertake joint manoeuvres and drills during the sea phase of coordinated patrol prior to Closing Ceremony which will be onboard of Myanmar Naval Ship.

- It will be procured by using its new financial power for emergency procurements sanctioned by the Defence Ministry earlier this month.
- Under this emergency financial powers, the armed forces have been set free for the procurement of equipments worth up to ₹300 crore on a priority basis.
- The Request for Proposal (RFP) for the two deals has been issued and negotiations are going on.
- Tenders for both deals had gone through regular procurement process.
- The Spike tender was cancelled during the cost negotiation phase, the deal for Igla, is in the cost negotiation phase, after repeated delays.
- The Army is working on to procure about 12 launchers and around 250 missiles for each system with the emergency route. Deliveries have to be completed in three months being extendable to six months.
- The Spike-LR (Long Range) being procured is a different variant from the one tested and shortlisted as part of the earlier procurement for over 8,000 missiles and 300 launchers along with technology transfer.
- The Spike-LR (Long Range) has a range of 4 km. It is yet unclear if additional trials would be performed as part of the emergency procurement.
- The deal for VSHORAD began in 2010 to replace the legacy Igla systems in service. It has since then seen several trials and re-trials.
- Officials said the emergency procurements were one of critical procurement and not related to the acquisitions through the regular route, in a bid to assure that these would not impact the regular deals.

- A space rock collided with the Moon at a speed of 61,000 km/hr during the total lunar eclipse in January, 2019, excavating a crater 10 to 15 metres.
- Observers watching the total eclipse of the Moon on 21st January, 2019, witnessed a short-lived flash as a meteorite hit the lunar surface.
- Researchers from the University of Huelva and Institute of Astrophysics of Andalusia in Spain used 8 telescopes to monitor the lunar surface during the event.
- The impact flash lasted 0.28 seconds and is the first ever filmed during a lunar eclipse, despite a number of earlier attempts.
- The incoming rock had a mass of 45 kilogrammes, measured 30 to 60 centimeters across, and hit the surface at 61,000 km/hr. The impact site is close to the crater Lagrange H, near the west-south-west portion of the lunar limb.
- The impact energy is estimated to have been an equivalent to 1.5 tonnes of TNT. The debris ejected is estimated to have reached a peak temperature of 5,400 degrees Celsius, roughly the same as the surface of the Sun.

Pangolins are under threat of extinction

- As per report dated **2nd May, 2019**, Indian Pangolin is currently under threat in Pakistan because of extensive illegal hunting for its scales, which are illegally exported to China to be used for traditional medicine.
- The scaly anteater, or Indian Pangolin, is a rare secretive mammal that lives on a diet of ants and termites, thus playing a vital role in the ecosystem.
- Pangolins are highly trafficked creatures. There are eight species of pangolins, and they are all protected by national and international laws. They are facing the threat of extinction.
- Pangolins look like reptiles, but they are mammals with a unique feature. They are the only known mammals to have large, keratin scales covering their skin used by them for protection.
- Eight species of Pangolins are as follows:
- **Asian Pangolin Species:** Chinese or Formosan pangolin – Critically Endangered; Malayan or Sunda pangolin – Critically Endangered; Indian or thick-tailed pangolin – Endangered; Palawan or Philippine pangolin – Endangered:
- **African Pangolin Species:** Tree or African white-bellied pangolin – Vulnerable; Giant ground pangolin – Vulnerable; Cape or Temminck's ground pangolin – Vulnerable; Long-tailed or black-bellied pangolin – Vulnerable:
- Pangolin scales have been used for endless applications, in particular as an ingredient in traditional Asian medicine to purportedly treat a variety of ailments.
- In 2016 CITES listed all eight species of pangolin in Appendix I, granting pangolins the strictest form of protection and banning all international commercial trade.
- Following the publication of **Scaling up Pangolin Conservation** (the first ever global conservation strategy for pangolins) in 2014, a number of pangolin range states have demonstrated leadership by developing national strategies for the species, and through the **IUCN SSC Pangolin Specialist Group**.
- Examples include Singapore, Taiwan (P.R China) and the Philippines among others.

- The **first ship** as per the agreement is to be delivered within **42 months** from the date of signing of the contract and subsequently, **two ships** are required to be delivered **per year**. The project completion time is **84 months**.
- The submarines will be equipped with **highly advanced state-of-the-art integrated platform management systems** including propulsion machinery, auxiliary machinery, power generation, and distribution machinery and damage control machinery, etc.
- **GRSE is a Kolkata based pioneer warship builder** of the nation.
- It is credited for having delivered the highest number of warships till date since its inception as a DPSU in 1960.
- **100 warships have been built by GRSE so far**. It ranges from Advanced Frigates to Anti-Submarine Warfare Corvettes to Fleet Tankers, Fast Attack Crafts, etc., with the Shipyard having many firsts to its credit in terms of Innovation and Design.

- Attendees at the conference will play out a fictional NEO impact scenario developed by the NASA Jet Propulsion Laboratory's Center for NEO Studies (CNEOS).
- Exercise leaders will brief participants on the status of the scenario at the end of each day and soliciting response ideas and feedback, based on the latest fictional data.
- NASA has participated in six NEO impact exercises so far – three at Planetary Defense Conferences (2013, 2015, and 2017) and three jointly with the Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA).

- **IN Ships** are on **return passage** from their successful deployment to South and East China Seas as part of the annual **Eastern Fleet Over Seas Deployment** during which they **visited Cam Ranh Bay, Vietnam, Qingdao, China and Busan, South Korea**.
- Whilst at Qingdao, both the ships had participated in the **International Fleet Review (IFR)** as part of the **70th Anniversary Celebration of PLA (Navy)**. During the ships' stay in Busan, the IN Ships took part in the Opening Ceremony of **Maritime Security (MS) Field Training Exercise (FTX)** under the aegis of ADMM-PLUS.
- On departing Busan, both the ships participated in **ADMM-PLUS MS FTX Phase I exercises** from 01 May to 03 May 19 off **South Korea** with Navies of Brunei, China, Malaysia, Philippines, Singapore, South Korea and the USA.
- Group Sail progressed from 03 May to 09 May. **The Phase II of ADMM-PLUS MS FTX** is scheduled from **09 May to 12 May 19 in the South China Sea**. On completion of Phase II, all participating ships including **IN Ships Kolkata and Shakti** are scheduled to attend the **closing ceremony of ADMM-PLUS MS** and participate in the **International Maritime Defence Expo (IMDEX) 2019 in Singapore**.

- This landing would be historically significant giving ISRO the **opportunity to name that site** on the moon.

Chandrayaan 2 Mission:

- The Chandrayaan 2 weighs around **3290 kgs**. It is a fully **indigenous project**.
- It would be launched from **Satish Dhawan Space Centre in Sriharikota** in Andhra Pradesh.
- The mission will **orbit around the moon** and carry out **remote sensing of the moon**.
- **Chandrayaan-2**, India's **second lunar mission**, has **three modules namely Orbiter, Lander (Vikram) & Rover (Pragyan)**.
- The **Orbiter and Lander modules will be interfaced mechanically** and stacked together as an integrated module and accommodated inside the **GSLV MK-III launch vehicle**.
- The **Rover** is housed inside the **Lander**.
- After launch into earth bound orbit by GSLV MK-III, the integrated module will **reach Moon orbit** using **Orbiter propulsion module**.
- Subsequently, Lander will separate from the Orbiter and soft land at the **predetermined site close to lunar South Pole**. Further, the Rover will roll out for carrying out scientific experiments on the lunar surface.
- **Instruments are also mounted** on Lander and Orbiter for carrying out scientific experiments.

Global plans:

- The lunar South Pole is supposed to **contain ice and other minerals**, and international space expedition plans are tying up with **NASA** planning to land **astronauts there by 2024**.
- **Neighbour China** has reportedly planned to build a **scientific research station** on the lunar South Pole within the next decade.

- The vaccine has been recommended by WHO for Pilot introduction in selected areas of 3 African countries – **Ghana, Kenya and Malawi** for the **malaria vaccine implementation programme (MVIP)**.
- **RTS, S/ASOI – trade name Mosquirix** – as a **recombinant protein based malaria vaccine**.
- Mosquirix – the brand name for RTS, S-trigger the immune system to defend against the first stages of the infections disease shortly after the malaria parasitic enters the blood stream through mosquito bite.
- RTS,S was created in 1987 by scientists working in GSK laboratories. In early 2001, GSK and PATH—with the support of the Bill & Melinda Gates Foundation—entered into a partnership to develop the vaccine for infants and young children living in malaria endemic regions in sub-Saharan Africa.
- RTS,S received a positive scientific opinion from the European Medicines Agency in 2015 and was recommended by the World Health Organization (WHO) for a pilot implementation program to assess the feasibility of administering the required four doses of the vaccine in children, the vaccine's role in reducing childhood deaths and severe malaria, and its safety in the context of routine use.
- The **country-led and WHO-coordinated Malaria Vaccine Implementation Programme** will also provide data and information for a WHO policy recommendation on the broader use of the vaccine.



About Malaria:

- **Malaria** is a life-threatening disease caused by parasites (**Plasmodium**) that are transmitted to people through the bites of infected **female Anopheles mosquitoes**. It is preventable and curable.
- Earlier In **2017**, there were an estimated **219 million cases** of malaria in **87 countries**.
- The estimated number of malaria deaths stood at **435 000** in **2017**.
- The **WHO African Region** carries a disproportionately high share of the global malaria burden. In **2017**, the region was home to **92% of malaria cases** and **93% of malaria deaths**.
- Total funding for **malaria control and elimination** reached an estimated **US\$ 3.1 billion in 2017**. Contributions from governments of endemic countries amounted to **US\$ 900 million**, representing **28% of total funding**.



- This led to make Rosenstein effectively the **only buffer between Mueller and the White House**.
- This was an even more crucial position to be held when the investigation started while examining whether Trump himself had obstructed justice by **firing Comey** and then trying to have Mueller sacked from the job.

- He remained in the job for a longer time to help **Barr in managing a redacted public release** of special counsel Robert Mueller's investigation.
- He had been **expected to resign** in March following the appointment of **William Barr** as attorney general.
- The report **cleared the Trump campaign of conspiring with Russia** to sway the **2016 election**, but did not exonerate the president of obstruction of justice.

- The award was received by India's envoy to the UN, Syed Akbaruddin on his behalf.
- The recipients for this year's award included military and police personnel, international civil servants, national staff and UN Volunteers from 38 countries who served in 12 different UN peace operations around the world.
- Since 1948, more than 3,800 peacekeepers have lost their lives in the 72 peacekeeping missions.
- The missions in Mali, South Sudan, the Central African Republic, Lebanon and the Democratic Republic of the Congo are among the most dangerous that we have ever undertaken.
- A total of 98 military, police and civilian peacekeepers from 36 countries lost their life last year in the peacekeeping mission.

Dag Hammarskjold Medal:

- This medal is named after the UN's second Secretary-General who died in a plane crash in the Congo in 1961.
- He was there trying for a peace agreement to end the conflict in the country.
- India is the fourth largest contributor of uniformed personnel to UN peacekeeping contributing to more than 6,400 military and police personnel to the UN peace operations currently in areas like Abyei, Cyprus, the Democratic Republic of the Congo, Haiti, etc.

- The India-Sweden Collaborative Industrial Research and Development Programme will see Swedish and Indian innovators work together and develop solutions that benefit both sides.
- Triple Helix model of innovation involves participation of government, industry and academia. This would be useful as these partners can work together towards using new technologies like artificial intelligence to develop solutions that help meet goals of sustainable development.
- Swedish companies like Volvo and Ericsson that have been present in the Indian market from a long time and newcomers like IKEA also have aggressive expansion plans for Indian market.

- Sweden has also stressed on the need for a Free Trade Agreement (FTA) between India and the European Union for ease of doing business for companies.

- In around **98.5 percent of their products** worldwide, **IFBA members** had **met the target of their 2016** commitment to reduce iTFAs to nutritionally inconsequential levels (**less than one gram of fat per 100 grams of product**) in their products.
- **Trans fat** is known to be the **worst form of fat** in food. It is responsible for over **5,00,000 deaths globally** due to severe heart disease each year.



- As the Indian Army was becoming a more networked and digitized force, the COAS emphasized on the need to enhance technological threshold of all ranks so as to imbibe state of art technology and exploit the same.
- The need to appreciate role of women officers in view of their permanent commission and align their employment gainfully with organizational requirements has been concurred by all.
- Avenues for making the lady officers experts in foreign languages, artificial intelligence, data management, cyber and space domains are being examined.

- Both the co-chairs **appreciated the strong, robust and growing bilateral ties between India and the U.S.** across the entire spectrum of trade and commerce.
- Both sides expressed satisfaction over the progress during the year 2018, with **bilateral trade in Goods and Services registering a growth of 12.6% from \$ 126 billion in 2017 to \$142 billion in 2018.**
- **The US** will make a decision on the **preferential tariffs on \$5.6 billion of Indian exports** after May 23, when India gets a new government.
- India's benefit under the **US' Generalized System of Preferences (GSP)** were scheduled to end on the second week of May.
- India appreciated the **US Trade Winds Indo-Pacific Business Forum and Mission initiative 2019**, being held **at New Delhi**. The forum will bring together distributors, representatives and partners and enable them to increase sales by taking part in **business-to-business meetings from 8-10th May, 2019**, across India.

US-India SME Forum:

- Both co-chairs also complimented the new bilateral private sector led Small Business Interaction initiative, the **US – India SME Forum**, held today in the forenoon in New Delhi.
- This is the **first event of its kind** and would pave the way for **collaboration and partnership** between the U.S. and Indian small and medium enterprises (SMEs) in the areas of manufacturing and services.
- Both sides also discussed various **outstanding trade issues**. Both sides agreed to engage regularly at various levels to resolve outstanding trade issues by exploring suitable solutions, which are mutually beneficial and promote economic development and prosperity in both countries.
- Both sides agreed to **deepen economic cooperation** and bilateral trade by ensuring greater cooperation amongst stakeholders, including Government, businesses and entrepreneurs.





- PM Modi unveiled a roadmap for development of tribal areas of Madhya Pradesh over the next five years. Under the plan, Rs 2 lakh crore will be spent for development of areas under tribal panchayats.



About Panchayati Raj:

- In India, the Panchayati Raj generally refers to the system of local self-government in India introduced by 73rd Constitutional Amendment in 1992, although it is based upon the traditional panchayat system of the Indian sub-continent.
- This Panchayati Raj System was formalized in 1992, following a study conducted by a number of Indian committees on various ways of implementing more decentralized administration.
- The Panchayati Raj now functions as a system of governance in which gram panchayats are the basic units of local administration.
- The system has three levels: Gram Panchayat (village level), Mandal Parishad or Block Samiti or Panchayat Samiti (block level), and Zila Parishad (district level).
- Currently, the Panchayati Raj system exists in all states except Nagaland, Meghalaya, and Mizoram and in all Union Territories except Delhi.

First Asian Country to legalise same sex marriage

Question: Which country became the first in Asian continent to legalise same sex marriage?

Related facts:

- **Taiwan** became the **first country in Asia to legalise same-sex marriage**.
- It was legalized on **May 17 2019** as thousands of demonstrators outside parliament cheered and waved rainbow flags after the parliament passed the law.
- With this, Taiwan`s parliament become the **first in Asia to legalise same-sex marriage**.
- The island`s constitutional court ruled in **2017** that **same-sex couples** had the right to **legally marry** and the Parliament was given a **two-year deadline** and was required to pass the changes by **24 May 2019**.
- **The bill:**
 - Lawmakers in the parliament debated over **three different bills** to legalise same-sex unions. The most progressive of the three; **the government`s bill** was passed.
 - The two other bills submitted by **conservative lawmaker** have referred partnerships as **“same-sex family relationships”** or **“same-sex unions”** rather than **“marriages”**.
 - Lawmakers from the majority **Democratic Progressive Party (DPP)** backed the bill, which passed **66 to 27**.
 - The bill offers **similar legal protections for marriage to same-sex couples** as heterosexuals. It will take effect after **Tsai** signs it into law.
 - Taipei`s **colourful gay pride parade** is one of **Asia`s largest parades**. It puts on display every year the vitality of the island`s lesbian, gay, bisexual and transgender **(LGBT) community**.
 - Taiwan **voters opposed same-sex marriage** last year in a series of referendums, defining marriage as being between a man and a woman.
