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National

India State of Forest Report, 2019

Question: On the 30th of December 2019, the State of Forest Report 2019 was released. According to this report, which of the following states tops in the forest cover increase?

(a) Andhra Pradesh (b) Kerala (c) Himachal Pradesh

(d) Karnataka Answer: (d) Related facts:

- On 30th December 2019, the Union Minister for Environment, Forest and Climate Change, Prakash Javadekar released the biennial "India State of Forest Report (ISFR)", in New Delhi.
- ISFR provides comprehensive information about the forest and tree cover, bamboo resources, carbon stock and forest fires.



Key Findings of ISFR 2019

- The total forest cover of the country is 7,12,249 sq. km which is 21.67% of the geographical area of the country. The tree cover of the country is estimated as 95,027 sq km which is 2.89% of the geographical area.
- The total Forest and Tree cover of the country is 8,07,276 sq. km which is 24.56% of the geographical area of the country.
- The current assessment shows an increase of 3,976 sq km (0.56%) of forest cover, 1,212 sq km (1.29%) of tree cover and 5,188 sq km (0.65%) of forest and tree cover put together, at the national level as compared to the previous assessment i.e. ISFR 2017.
- Forest cover within the Recorded Forest Area/ Green Wash (RFA/GW) has shown a slight decrease of 330 sq km (0.05%) whereas there is an increase of 4,306 sq km of forest cover outside the RFA/GW as compared to previous assessment of 2017.
- The top five States in terms of increase in forest cover are Karnataka (1,025 sq km), Andhra Pradesh (990 sq km), Kerala (823 sq km), Jammu & Kashmir (371 sq km) and Himachal Pradesh (334 sq km).
- Forest cover in the hill districts of the country is 2, 84,006 sq km, which is 40.30% of the total geographical area of these districts. The current assessment shows an increase of 544 sq km (0.19%) in 140 hill districts of the country.
- The total forest cover in the tribal districts is 4,22,351 sq km, which is 37.54% of the geographical area of these districts. The current assessment shows a decrease of 741 sq km of forest cover within the RFA/GW in the tribal districts and an increase of 1,922 sq km outside.
- Total forest cover in the North Eastern region is 1,70,541 sq km, which is 65.05% of its geographical area. The current assessment shows a decrease of forest cover to the extent of 765 sq km (0.45%) in the region. Except Assam and Tripura, all the States in the region show decrease in forest cover.

- Mangrove cover in the country has increased by 54 sq km (1.10%) as compared to the previous assessment.
- The total growing stock of wood in the country is estimated 5,915.76 million cum comprising 4,273.47 million cum inside forest areas and 1,642.29 million cum outside recorded forest areas (TOF). The average growing stock per hectare in forest has been estimated as 55.69 cum.
- Total bamboo bearing area of the country is estimated as 1,60,037 sq km. There is an increase of 3,229 sq km in bamboo bearing area as compared to the estimate of ISFR 2017.
- In the present assessment, total carbon stock in forest is estimated as 7,124.6 million tonnes. There is an increase of 42.6 million tonnes in the carbon stock of the country as compared to the last assessment of 2017. The annual increase is 21.3 million tonnes, which is 78.1 million tonnes CO2 eq.
- Area-wise Madhya Pradesh has the largest forest cover in the country followed by Arunachal Pradesh, Chhattisgarh, Odisha and Maharashtra.
- In terms of forest cover as percentage of total geographical area, the top five States are Mizoram (85.41%), Arunachal Pradesh (79.63%), Meghalaya (76.33%), Manipur (75.46%) and Nagaland (75.31%).
- The total mangrove cover in the country is 4,975 sq km.
- In the present assessment, total carbon stock in forest is estimated as 7,124.6 million tonnes. There is an increase of 42.6 million tonnes in the carbon stock of the country as compared to the last assessment of 2017. The annual increase is 21.3 million tonnes, which is 78.1 million tonnes CO2 eq.
- Soil Organic Carbon (SOC) represents the largest pool of carbon stock in forests, which has been estimated 4,004 million tonnes. The SOC contributes 56% to the total forest carbon stock of the country.
- There are 62,466 wetlands covering 3.83% of the area within the RFA/GW of the country. The total number of wetlands located within the RFA/GW is 8.13%.
 Amongst the States, Gujarat has largest area of wetlands within RFA in the country followed by West Bengal.
- Dependence of fuelwood on forests is highest in the State of Maharashtra, whereas, for fodder, small timber and bamboo, dependence is highest in Madhya Pradesh. It has been assessed that the annual removal of the small timber by the people living in forest fringe villages is nearly 7% of the average annual yield of forests in the country.
- The information on area affected by five major invasive species in States/UTs based on analysis of NFI data has been given in the present ISFR.
- Fire prone forest areas of different severity classes have been mapped in the grids of 5km x 5km based on the frequency of forest fires. The analysis reveals that 21.40% of the forest cover of the country is highly to extremely fire prone.

Some Major Findings

- An increase of 54 sq Km in mangrove cover has been observed as compared to the previous assessment of 2017.
- Top three states showing mangrove cover increase are Gujarat (37 sq km) followed by Maharashtra (16 sq km) and Odisha (8 sq km).
- The total growing stock of India's forest and TOF is estimated 5,915.76 million cum of which 4,273.47 million cum is inside the forests and 1,642.29 million cum outside.

- There is an increase of 93.38 million cum of total growing stock, as compared to the previous assessment. Out of this the increase in growing stock, there is an increase of 55.08 million cum inside the forests and 38.30 million cum outside the forest areas.
- The extent of bamboo bearing area of the country has been estimated 16.00 million hectare. There is an increase of 0.32 million hectare in bamboo bearing area as compared to the last assessment of ISFR 2017. The total estimated green weight of bamboo culms is 278 million tonnes, slowly an increase of 88 million tonnes as compared to ISFR 2017.
- Under the current assessment the total carbon stock in country's forest is estimated 7,124.6 million tonnes and there an increase of 42.6 million tonnes in the carbon stock of country as compared to the last assessment of 2017. The annual increase in the carbon stock is 21.3 million tonnes, which is 78.2 million tonnes CO2 eq.
- Wetlands within forest areas form important ecosystems and add richness to the biodiversity in forest areas, both of faunal and floral species. Due to importance of wetlands, FSI has carried out an exercise at the national level to identify wetlands of more than 1 ha within RFA. There are 62,466 wetlands covering 3.8% of the area within the RFA/GW of the country.

Indian Forest Status Report of Uttar Pradesh, 2019

- According to the ISFR 2019, the total recorded forest area in Uttar Pradesh is 16,582 square kilometers which is 6.88% of the total geographical area.
- As per statutory status, it has 72.79% of reserved forest, 6.98% protected forest and 20.23% unclassed forest.
- According to ISFR 2019, the total forest cover of Uttar Pradesh is 14,805.65 square kilometers (Based on the interpretation of IRS Resourcesat-2 LISS III satellite data of the period Oct 2017 to Jan 2018) which is 6.15% of the total area of Uttar Pradesh.
- There are 2,616.43 square kilometers of very dense forest (1.09%), 4080.04 square kilometers of moderately dense forest (1.69%) and 81.09.18 square kilometers are open forest (3.37%).
- The forest cover in the state has increased by 126.65 sq km as compared to revised figures of ISFR 2017.
- Five districts with highest forest area percentage in total area (in decreasing order) Sonbhadra, Chandauli, Pilibhit, Mirzapur and Chitrakoot.
- In Uttar Pradesh, the tree cover is 3.05% of the total area (7342 sq km).
- In Uttar Pradesh, the area of scrubs is 587 sq km in (0.24%).
- Sonbhadra, the district with the maximum forest cover in Uttar Pradesh (36.79 % of the geographical area of 6905 square kilometers).
- Bhadohi (Sant Ravidas Nagar), the district with the minimum forest cover in Uttar Pradesh (0.10% of the geographical area of 1015 square kilometers).
- Lakhimpur Kheri district is very densely forested area in the state (804.91 square kilometers).
- Maximum moderate forested area (967 square kilometers) and open forest area (1443.29 square kilometers) in Sonbhadra district.

Important statistics related to forest area

• 5 districts with maximum forest area percentage (decreasing order):

Sonbhadra(36.79%), Chandauli (22.25%), Pilibhit (18.64%), Mirzapur(18.25%), Chitrakoot(18.23%).

• 5 districts with maximum forest area percentage (in increasing order):

Sant Ravidas Nagar (0.31%), Mainpuri (0.49%), Deoria (0.60%), Budaun (0.62%), Mau (0.64%).

- 5 districts with maximum forest area (in decreasing order) are Sonbhadra(2540.29 sq km), Kheri(1273.06 sq km), Mirzapur (803.73 sq km), Pilibhit (687.11 sqkm), Chitrakoot (586.40 sq km).
- 5 districts with minimum forest area (in increasing order):

Bhadohi (3.12 sq km), Mau (11 sq km), Mainpuri(14sq km), Sant Kabir Nagar(14 sqkm), Deoria(15.21 sqkm).

KVIC opened first silk processing plant in Gujarat

Question: Where did Khadi and Village Industries Commission (KVIC) inaugurate first Silk Processing Plant?

Answer: (a) Related facts:

- On 3rd December 2019, Khadi and Village Industries Commission (KVIC) inaugurated first Silk Processing Plant at Surendranagar in Gujarat.
- The plant will cut down the cost of production of silk yarn drastically and increase the sale and availability of raw material for Gujarati Patola Sarees locally
- Sarees locally.
 The plant has been set up by a khadi institution at a cost of Rs 75 lack in which KVIC has contributed Rs 60 lakh.
- The unit has employed 90 local women, 70 of which belong to the Muslim community.
- Patola, the trademark Saree of Gujarat, is considered to be very costly and worn only by the Royals or the Aristocrat. Reason being the raw material silk yarn is purchased from Karnataka or West Bengal, where silk processing units are situated.
- Now, cocoons will be brought from Karnataka and West Bengal and Silk yarn will be processed in house, thus reducing the cost of production and giving a major boost to the sale of famous Gujarati Patola Sarees.

India's first Chief of Defence Staff

Question: Who has been appointed India's first Chief of Defence Staff on December 30.2019?

Answer: (a) Related facts:

- On 30th December 2019, General Bipin Rawat was appointed India's first Chief of Defence Staff (CDS).
- He will serve as the first CDS till March 2022.
- The Chief of the Defence Staff (CDS) is the professional head of the Indian Armed Forces and the senior-most uniformed military adviser to the Indian government.
- CDS will function as a single-point advisor to the government on matters related to the military and will focus on the better synergy between the Indian Army, Indian Air Force and the Indian Navy.
- The Chief of Defence Staff will also head the Department of Military Affairs (DMA), to be created within the Ministry of Defence and function as its Secretary.
- The Chief of Defence Staff, apart from being the head of the Department of Military Affairs, will also be the Permanent Chairman of the Chiefs of Staff Committee.
- He will act as the Principal Military Adviser to Defence Minister on all tri-Services matters.
- Defence Ministry has amended the army, air force, and navy rules by bringing in a new clause that allows the CDS to serve up to a maximum age of 65 years.

CDS-a four star rank officer:

 The four-star rank of an officer in India is given to 5 officers. It includes Admiral of Indian Navy, Air Chief Marshal of Indian Air Force, General of Indian Army and Director of Intelligence Bureau. Now, the rank is given to CDS officer as well.

Background:

- The position was first officially suggested in 1999 following the Kargil War through the recommendations of the Kargil Review Committee.
- PM Narendra Modi in his Independence Day speech announced the creation of Chief of Defence Staff, CDS to further sharpen coordination between the forces.
- On 24 December 2019, Union Cabinet chaired by Prime Minister Narendra Modi has approved to create the post of Chief of Defence Staff.
- The other countries that hold Chief of Defence Staff in the world includes Italy, France, China, Spain, UK, Canada and Japan.

Indian Railways to Launch Tejas Express from Ahmedabad

- India's second premium Tejas train will be operated between Ahmedabad and Mumbai.
- The inaugural run of this second Tejas Train will be flagged off from Ahmedabad on 17th January, 2020.
- However, the commercial run of the train will start with effect from 19th January, 2020 from Ahmedabad.
- Prior to this on 04 October 2019, Tejas Express on Lucknow-Delhi route was flagged off by Uttar Pradesh Chief Minister Yogi Adityanath in Lucknow.
- Tejas Express is India's first private train run by the Indian Railways. It a more premium version of the Shatabdi Express category of air-conditioned chair cars.
- All passengers travelling on IRCTC train will be provided with Rail Travel Insurance of up to Rs. 25 Lakhs, free of cost by IRCTC.
- This complimentary travel insurance also includes an exclusive coverage of Rs. 1 lakh against household theft / robbery during the travel period of the passengers.
- Besides, this special feature, in a first of its own, IRCTC will also pay a compensation of Rs. 100/- in case the train during its run, is delayed by more than one hour and Rs. 250/- in case of delay of more than two hours to every passenger as compensation.

- Bollywood superstar Salman Khan, who had ruled at the top for the previous three years, slipped down to the third position in 2019 with Rs 229.25 crore in earnings.
- Famous Bollywood actor Amitabh Bachchan stood fourth in the list with a wealth of Rs 239.25 crore.
- Former India captain Mahendra Singh Dhoni retains his No 5 spot on the 2019 Forbes India Celebrity 100.
- Famous Bollywood actor Shah Rukh Khan finished 6th, Ranbir Singh 7th, Bollywood actress Alia Bhatt 8th, Sachin Tendulkar 9th and Deepika Padukone 10th.
- Among other prominent celebrities, Rajinikanth finished 13th, Priyanka Chopra 14th and Aamir Khan 15th.
- Among the women cricketers, Mithali, Raj (88th), Smriti Mandhana (90th) and Harmanpreet Kaur (91st) were also featured in this list.
- Other athletes in the list include shuttler PV Sindhu (63rd), Saina Nehwal (81st), wrestler Bajrang Punia (94th), boxer MC Mary Kom (87th), tennis player Rohan Bopanna (98th), footballer Sunil Chhetri (85th) and golfer Arniban Lahiri. (95th).

- On 29 December 2019,Uttar Pradesh Chief Minister Yogi Adityanath announced to give a pension of Rs 6,000 per annum to victims of Triple Talaq.
- This new initiative will ensure easiness to victims of triple talaq and women abandoned by their husbands by giving Rs 500 per month as pension.
- The Muslim Women (Protection of Rights on Marriage) Act, 2019 declares the practice of Triple Talaq as illegal, unconstitutional and made it punishable.
- The Act makes declaration of talaq a cognizable offence, attracting up to three years' imprisonment with a fine.
- A cognizable offence is one for which a police officer may arrest an accused person without warrant.

- General Election Result to the State Legislative Assembly of Jharkhand was announced by Election Commission of India on 23rd December, 2019.
- The election for a total of 81 seats were held in five phases from 30 November to 20 December 2019.
- Hemant Soren led Jharkhand Mukti Morcha emerged the largest party by winning 31 seats.
- While its opponent Bhartiya Janata Party won 25 seats.
- Indian National Congress got 16 seats. Rashtriya Janata Dal secured 1 seat.
- Among other parties, the Jharkhand Vikas Morcha (Prajatantrik) bagged 3 seats,
 AJSU won 2 seats and the Communist Party of India (Marxist-Leninist) (Liberation)
 & Nationalist Congress Party won 1 seat each.
- Two independents also won in their respective constituencies.
- Incumbent CM Raghubar Das was dethroned from his bastion Jamshedpur East by independent Saryu Roy.

Government making:

- The Jharkhand Mukti Morcha-Congress-RJD alliance with 47 seats moved forward to make government in the state.
- On 29th December 2019, Jharkhand Mukti Morcha, JMM leader Hemant Soren took oath as the 11th Chief Minister of Jharkhand. This is 44 year Soren' second stint as Jharkhand Chief Minister.
- Governor Draupadi Murmu administered the oath of office to Soren at Morhabadi grounds in Ranchi.
- Along with Soren, Congress Legislature Party Leader Alamgir Alam, state Congress president Rameshwar Oraon and only MLA of RJD Satyanand Bhokta were also sworn in as state cabinet ministers.

- On December 28, 2019, a trial run of the first freight train was conducted on the newly built Rewari-Madar section of Western Dedicated Freight Corridor (WDFC).
- The train was flagged off by Dedicated Freight Corporation India Limited (DFCIL).
- The Rewari-Madar section is in Haryana State (for approximately 79 Km in Mahendragarh & Rewari districts) and Rajasthan State (for approximately 227 Km in Jaipur, Ajmer, Sikar, Nagaur & Alwar districts).
- Total cost of works on this section is Rs. 3918 Crore, excluding land.
- The opening of this stretch will benefit various industries in Rewari Manesar, Narnaul, Phulera & Kishangarh areas of Rajasthan & Haryana.
- In its roadmap to ensure faster delivery, DFCCIL will run freight trains at the maximum speed of 100 Kmph hour as against the current maximum speed of 75 kmph.




Visit of Prime Minister of Portugal to India

Related facts:

- Portuguese Prime Minister Antonio Costa visited India on 19-20 December 2019.
- It is noteworthy that Antonio Costa's current visit to India is his first bilateral visit outside Europe after being re-elected as Prime Minister on October 6, 2019.



- This meeting of the Organizing Committee was presided over by the President Ram Nath Kovind.
- On December 19, 2019, he held official talks with Prime Minister Narendra Modi.
- This was the third official meeting between the Prime Ministers in a span of 3 years.
- The high level political exchanges between India and Portugal have imparted a robust momentum to bilateral relations, including in several new areas such as science and technology, defence, startups, shipping, youth exchanges and culture.

India –Portugal Relations:

- Diplomatic relations between the two countries were established in the year 1949.
- The two countries share an excellent political relationship today.
- Portugal is supporting of India's bid for a permanent seat in the United Nations Security Council.
- Portugal is the first member country of the European Union to agree to extradition if anyone is facing charges in India.
- In October 2005, Portugal extradited Abu Salem and Monica Bedi to India facing terror charges in India.
- On October 9, 2015, Portugal became the first European and western country, and only the fourth outside the East Asia Summit, to sign a Memorandum of Understanding on the Establishment of the Nalanda University in India.

- he decision to construct a strategic tunnel below the Rohtang Pass was taken in 2000 when late Atal Bihari Vajpayee was the Prime Minister. The foundation stone for the Access Road to the South Portal of the tunnel was laid in 2002.
- The 8.8-kilometre long tunnel is the world's longest tunnel above an altitude of 3,000 metres. It will reduce the distance between Manali and Leh by 46 kilometres. It is a 10.5-metre wide single tube bi-lane tunnel with a fire proof emergency egress tunnel built into the main tunnel itself.
- The tunnel is now nearing completion and will providing all weather connectivity to remote border areas of Himachal Pradesh and Ladakh which otherwise remained cut off from the rest of the country for about six months during winters.

Nirbhaya Fund:

- The Nirbhaya fund was set up in 2013 with Rs.1000 crores corpus by the Congress party-led govt. as a tribute to a 23-year-old Delhi gang-rape victim. Nirbhaya (fearless) was the pseudonym given to the victim to hide the original identity.
- The Nirbhaya Fund can be utilized for projects of women safety and security.
- Ministry of Women and Child Development (MoWCD) is the nodal authority for the Nirbhaya Fund in place of Home Ministry. It is the authority for appraising/recommending the proposals/schemes to be funded under Nirbhaya Fund.
- Earlier, MoWCD was the one releasing the funds but now it examines the programmes submitted to it by the states under Nirbhaya scheme, approves them and recommends to the department of economic affairs for allocating funds.

Nirbhaya fund administration:

- The Nirbhaya Fund Framework provides for a non-lapsable corpus fund for safety and security of women administered by the Department of Economic Affairs (DEA) of the Ministry of Finance (MoF) of the Government of India.
- Further, it provides for an Empowered Committee (EC) of officers chaired by the Secretary, Ministry of Women & Child Development (MWCD) to appraise and recommend proposals to be funded under this framework.

Failing in motive:

 Despite of handsome funding, Nirbhaya Fund hasn't earned significant achivement to ensure women safety. The horrific gangrape and murder of a woman veterinarian in Telangana, and similar incidents in Bihar, Rajasthan and Karnataka indicate that women are as unsafe and fearful today as they were on the eve of Nirbhaya gangrape and murder case.

- The scheme aims to improve ground water management through community participation in identified priority areas in seven States, viz. Gujarat, Haryana, Karnataka, Madhya Pradesh, Maharashtra, Rajasthan and Uttar Pradesh.
- Implementation of the scheme is expected to benefit nearly 8350 Gram Panchayats in 78 districts in these States.
- ATAL JAL has been designed with the principal objective of strengthening the institutional framework for participatory ground water management and bringing about behavioral changes at the community level for sustainable ground water resource management.
- The scheme envisages undertaking this through various interventions, including awareness programmes, capacity building, convergence of ongoing/new schemes and improved agricultural practices etc.

Background:

- Ground water contributes to nearly 65% of total irrigated area of the country and nearly 85% of the rural drinking water supply.
- The limited ground water resources in the country are under threat due to the increasing demands of growing population, urbanization and industrialization.
- Intensive, and unregulated ground water pumping in many areas has caused rapid and widespread decline in ground water levels as well as reduction in the sustainability of ground water abstraction structures.
- The increasing stress on ground water due to over- exploitation, contamination and associated environmental impacts threaten to endanger the food security of the nation, unless necessary preventive / remedial measures are taken on priority.

- A pharmacopoeia (from the obsolete typography pharmacopœia, literally, "drugmaking"), in its modern technical sense, is a book containing directions for the identification of compound medicines, and published by the authority of a government or a medical or pharmaceutical society.
- Recently, the Indian Pharmacopoeia (IP) has been recognised formally by the National Department of Regulation of Medicines and Health Products of the Ministry of Public Health of Islamic Republic of Afghanistan.
- It will also be **used based** on the requirement as **reputable pharmacopoeia in the laboratory of medicines** and health products quality.
- With this, a new beginning has been made and Afghanistan has become the first country to recognize IP pursuant to the efforts of Department of Commerce and Ministry of Health and Family Welfare.

The Indian Pharmacopoeia:

- IP is an **officially recognized book of standards** as per the **Drugs and Cosmetics Act, 1940 and Rules 1945** there under.
- The IP specifies the **standards of drugs manufactured and marketed** in India in terms of their identity, purity and strength.
- The quality, efficacy and safety of the medicines are important from healthcare perspective. In order to ensure the quality of medicinal products, the legal and scientific standards are provided by Indian Pharmacopoeia Commission (IPC) in the form of Indian Pharmacopoeia (IP).
- As per, the Second Schedule of the Drugs and Cosmetics Act, IP is designated
 as the official book of standards for drugs imported and/or manufactured for
 sale, stock or exhibition for sale or distribution in India.
- The IP Commission's mission is to promote public and animal health in India by bringing out authoritative and officially accepted standards for quality of drugs including active pharmaceutical ingredients, excipients and dosage forms, used by health professionals, patients and consumers.
- This is achieved by developing the standards for medicines and supporting their implementation. In addition, IPC also develops IP Reference Substances (IPRS) that act as fingerprint for identification of an article under test and its purity as prescribed in the IP monographs.

Commerce and Industry Minister meets export promotion Councils

Question: Where did the meeting of the Export Promotion Council take place with the Union Commerce and Industry Minister on December 20 2019?

 Union Minister for Commerce and Industry & Railways, Piyush Goyal met with all Export Promotion Councils (EPCs), Federation of Indian Export Organisation (FIEO) and Commodity Boards under the Department of Commerce, Ministry of Commerce and Industry in New Delhi.

 Piyush Goyal reviewed and sought inputs from EPCs for the Foreign Trade Policy and got their views on steps that may be taken to boost India's exports. Pre-budget inputs from EPCs were

also taken by the Finance Ministry.

Major highlights of the meeting:

- Thirty-seven EPCs, FIEO and three
 Commodity Boards of the Department of
 Commerce attended the meeting and took this
 opportunity to discuss with Commerce and
 Industry Minister each and every issue that the
 - Councils are facing while exporting merchandise and services and also give their feedback on the various initiatives that are being taken by the Ministry of Commerce and Industry to ease lending and credit availability to exporters.
- The EPCs also gave their views on India's FTAs/ PTAs with other countries especially ASEAN.
- The problem of **exporters identified as "risky exporters"** by CBIC was taken up and Commerce and Industry Minister directed that a **nodal officer be appointed** in the office of Directorate General of Foreign Trade (DGFT) and he urged the Councils to send a list of those identified as risky exporters to the nodal officer in DGFT so that this issue may be taken up with the Finance Ministry.
- Commerce and Industry Minister further suggested that rationalization of EPCs
 must be taken up in order to avoid duplication of work and suggested that the
 big exporters may continue to be part of FIEO and smaller Councils may merge with
 bigger EPCs that deal with products of similar nature.
- Commerce and Industry Minister urged exporters to make use of the NIRVIK
 (Niryat Rin Vikas Yojana) Scheme that will soon be approved by Cabinet so
 that exporters are able to access easy lending and enhanced loan
 availability that will cover 90% of the principle interest and will also include both pre
 and post shipment credit.
- The top 5 products in global exports, accounting for over 50%, are electrical & electronic products, petroleum goods, machinery, automobile and plastic goods. However, their share in India's exports is less than 33%.
- India's global share in these 5 products, put together, is about 1%. Therefore, the New FTP should facilitate the export of these products.
- The issue of India's low share in high technology exports was also discussed by FIEO. High technology exports accounts for 6.3% of our exports, whereas the same is 29% for China, 32% for South Korea, 34% for Vietnam, 39% for Singapore.

ADB, India sign loan for energy efficiency investments in India

 The Asian Development Bank (ADB) and the Government of India on 16th December 2019 signed a \$250 million loan to Energy Efficiency Services Limited (EESL) to expand energy efficiency investments in India that will benefit agricultural, residential and institutional consumers.



- In addition, \$46 million financing will be provided from the Clean Technology Fund (CTF), to be administered by ADB.
- ADB previously approved a \$200 million loan to EESL, a public sector energy service company, in 2016 for Demand Side Energy Efficiency Sector Project that focused on efficient lighting and appliances.

Major highlights of the loan:

- The project is expected to contribute to the mission of Government of India to promote energy efficiency and meet Government's commitments to reduce energy intensity of the economy.
- The introduction of energy-efficient technologies in eligible states including smart meters, distributed solar photovoltaic systems and electric vehicles will help reduce electricity network losses and reduce greenhouse gas emissions.
- The project's smart metering component will help address billing and collection inefficiencies. EESL will also explore business models to generate greater public demand for e-vehicles to support India's current push for electric vehicles.
- Promoting awareness of the benefits of using energy efficient technologies is another feature of the project. Awareness campaigns will engage local organisations in knowledge-sharing and training, with a focus on women electricity consumers.
- Accompanying the loan will be a technical assistance (TA) of \$2 million to support EESL in implementing the project, including a gender action plan, mobilising private sector participation in energy efficiency services, identifying new business opportunities, and transferring knowledge about successful models.
- The TA will also support the identification and development of new subprojects and pilot test some technologies. The grant comes from the Clean Technology Fund, to be administered by ADB.

- ADB is committed to achieving a prosperous, inclusive, resilient, and sustainable Asia and the Pacific, while sustaining its efforts to eradicate extreme poverty. In 2018, it made commitments of new loans and grants amounting to \$21.6 billion.

- As water security is a global issue, the NMCG has been taking a global call to action

- Recently, a massive river rafting expedition called 'Ganga Aamantran
 Abhiyan' was launched from Devprayag on 10th October, 2019. The expedition covered around 2,500 KM length of the Ganga during its 34-day journey till Ganga Sagar in West Bengal.
- Quality of water in the Ganga has improved tremendously in the last five years. Five years earlier, only tens of Gangetic dolphins were sighted, but this time they have observed more than 2,000 dolphins and all other aquatic life has improved.
- The **Union Cabinet** chaired by the Prime Minister Narendra Modi has given its approval for **establishment of the Clean Ganga Fund (CGF)**.
- The Jal Shakti Minister said the approach in **Namami Gange for ensuring Aviral Dhara or improving flows is comprehensive**.
- The **role of academic institutions** including IITs, NITs, NEERI etc from India and the European Union, Germany, Denmark, Israel, Japan and Canada for Technology Collaboration Agreements with c-Ganga (Centre for Ganga River Basin Management and Studies) in cleaning Ganga was lauded in the summit.
- Under the first draft of the Ganga River Basin Management Plan
 (GRBMP) submitted by a consortium of IITs in 2015, projects for liquid pollution
 abatement in Ganga river basin have already been sanctioned and are at various
 stages of implementation and more of such projects will come for the tributaries for
 the Ganga rivers as well.
- India holds only about 4% of global freshwater compared to around 18% of its population and an equivalent percentage of livestock population.
- It was mentioned that **Jal Jeevan Mission (JJM)**, like the Swachh Bharat Mission (SBM), will be completed within the stipulated five year **period by 2024**.

New round of RCS-UDAN scheme launched

- Following the three successful rounds of bidding, the Ministry of Civil Aviation
 has launched the 4th round of Regional Connectivity Scheme (RCS)UdeDeshKaAamNagrik(UDAN) to further enhance the connectivity to remote and
 regional areas of the country.
- The focus of this round would be the priority areas like NER, Hilly States, J&K, Ladakh and Islands.

Some of the key features of the Scheme are:

Revision of (Viability Gap Funding) VGF cap: The provision of VGF for Category 2 / 3 aircraft (more than 20 seater) has been enhanced for operation of RCS flights in Priority Area(s) (Union Territories [UT] of Ladakh and Jammu & Kashmir; the States of Himachal Pradesh, Uttrakhand, North Eastern State; UT of Lakshadweep and Andaman & Nicobar).



- Promoting short-haul routes The provision of VGF would be restricted for routes with stage length up to 600 kms, for operation of Category 2 / 3 aircraft, beyond it no monetary support would be provided. The table for provision of VGF for various stage lengths would be available for stage length up to 500 kms.
- Well defined Prioritization framework Airports that has already been developed by AAI would be given higher priority for award of VGF under the Scheme, followed by airports not part of the above list but located Priority Area(s) would be given a priority, followed by airports located in areas other than Priority Area(s).
- Flexibility to change the frequency of flight operation The Selected Airline Operator (SAO) would be allowed to change the frequency of flight operation, during the tenure of flight operation of the given route, provided that the total scheduled flight operation submitted as part of the Technical Proposal, is conformed and adhered to within a period of one year.
- Inclusion of helicopter and sea plane operation under NSOP license The operation of helicopter and sea plane would be allowed under this round.

Progress of UDAN 1, 2 and 3

- In the last three years MoCA has successfully completed three rounds of bidding under the Scheme and awarded about 700 routes.
- Under UDAN-1 scheme, a total of 56 routes were awarded in which 53 routes have got operationalized.
- Similarly under UDAN-2 scheme, a total of 297 routes were awarded in which 104 routes have got operationalized.
- Under UDAN-3 scheme, a total of 335 routes were awarded in which 74 rountes have got operationalized.
- Efforts are made to develop the airports and operationalize the pending routes. Many of these routes will be operationalized during the winter schedule 2019.
- MoCA aims to operationalize 1000 routes and more than 100 airports in the next five years. This would be achieved by focusing on operationalizing routes in Priority Areas.
- AAI would focus on developing no-frills airport in the future and routes connecting such airports would be prioritized for award of VGF.

- The salient feature in the Political Parties Registration Tracking Management System is that the applicant (who is applying for party registration from 1st January, 2020 onwards) will be able to track the progress of his / her application and will get status update through SMS and email.

OF INDIA

- The applicant is required to provide contact mobile number and email address of the party / applicant in his application if he/she wishes to track the progress of the application.
- The Registration of Political Parties is governed by the provisions of section 29A of the Representation of the People Act, 1951.
- A party seeking registration under the said section with the Commission has to submit an application to the Commission within a period of 30 days following the date of its formation in prescribed format with basic particulars about the party such as name, address, membership details of various units, names of office bearers, etc, as required under sub-section (4) of the said section, and such other particulars that the Commission has specified under sub-section (6) of Section 29A of the Representation of the People Act, 1951, as mentioned in the Guidelines for registration.

- The BRICS countries, Brazil, the Russian Federation, India, China and South Africa discussed on spheres of political and socioeconomic coordination.



- This year's meeting covered the areas
 of finance, trade, foreign affairs, national security matters, communications,
 environment, labor and employment, science, technology and innovation, energy,
 agriculture, health and culture.
- In order to reaffirm the shared goal of building a peaceful, stable and prosperous world,BRICS countries adopted the Brasilia Declaration.

Brasilia Declaration:

- It advocates and supports multilateralism as well as upholding the central role of the UN in international affairs and respecting international law.
- The declaration emphasizes the urgent need to strengthen and reform the multilateral system, including the UN, the WTO, the IMF and other international organizations which will support to enable emerging markets and developing countries in international decision-making.
- The rising protectionism arising due to trade war between China and the U.S. is hurting the global economy.So,multilateralism is crucial for emerging countries to protect their own interests.

India at the Summit:

- Attending the summit PM Modi called for paying special attention to mutual trade and investment, as Intra-BRICS trade accounts for just 15% of world trade, while the combined population is more than 40% of the world's population.
- Participating in the Leaders dialogue with BRICS Business Council and New Development Bank,PM Modi said that BRICS Business Council created a roadmap to achieve the \$ 500 billion Intra-BRICS trade target by the next summit.
- PM Modi proposed the first meeting of BRICS Water Ministers in India.
- India highlighted the menace of terrorism which has resulted in the loss of \$1 trillion to the world economy.

Meetings on the sidelines of the Summit:

India - Brazil:

- PM Modi invited the President of Brazil Jair Bolsonaro as the Chief Guest at the Republic Day 2020.
- Brazil has decided to grant visa-free travel to Indian citizens.

India - China:

- The countries have agreed to hold the next round of border talks. The 21st round of border talks were held in 2018 by Security Advisor Ajit Doval and his Chinese counterpart.
- The Chinese President invited the Indian Prime Minister for the 3rd informal summit in China in 2020. The first informal summit took place at Wuhan (China-2018) and second at Mamallapuram (India-2019).
- Both the leaders reviewed the preparations for celebrating the 70th anniversary (in 2020) of establishment of diplomatic relations between the countries.

India – Russia:

- PM Modi met his Russian counterpart Vladimir Putin and noted their satisfaction that the 25 billion USD trade target between the countries to be achieved by 2025 has already been achieved.
- To dismantle the barriers of trade at regional level, the first Bilateral Regional Forum will be held in 2020.

About BRICS:

- BRICS is the acronym coined for an association of five major emerging national economies: Brazil, Russia, India, China and South Africa.
- The group together represents about 42% of the population, 23% of GDP, 30% of the territory and 18% of the global trade.
- The acronym BRIC was first used in 2001 by Goldman Sachs to indicate the emerging powers that would be, alongside the United States, the five largest economies of the world in the 21st century.
- The 1st BRIC Summit was held in Yekaterinburg, Russia, on 16 June 2009.
- South Africa was invited to join BRIC in December 2010, after which the group adopted the acronym BRICS.
- The chairmanship of the forum is rotated annually among the members, in accordance with the acronym B-R-I-C-S. Brazil is the current chair of the grouping.
- During the Sixth BRICS Summit in Fortaleza (2014) the leaders signed the Agreement establishing the New Development Bank (NDB). They also signed the BRICS Contingent Reserve Arrangement.

- The United Nations Development Programme (UNDP) released the 2019 Human Development Report (HDR), entitled "Beyond income, beyond averages, beyond today: inequalities in human development in the 21st Century".
- India was ranked 129 out of 189 countries on the 2019 Human Development Index (HDI) up one position from the 130th rank in 2018.

Human Development Index:

- HDI emphasizes that rather than evaluating a country by GDO, it is much better to evaluate its human development.
- The HDI measures average achievement in three basic dimensions of human development —
- life expectancy
- education and
- per capita income

The rankings:

- Norway, Switzerland and Ireland occupied the top three positions in that order.
- Among India's neighbors, Sri Lanka (71) and China (85) are higher up the rank scale.
- Bhutan (134), Bangladesh (135), Myanmar (145), Nepal (147), Pakistan (152) and Afghanistan (170) were ranked lower on the list.

Region Wise Performance:

- South Asia was the fastest growing region in human development progress witnessing a 46% growth over 1990-2018.
- It is followed by East Asia and the Pacific at 43%.

Inequality-adjusted Human Development Index:

The IHDI indicates percentage loss in HDI due to inequality.

- India's HDI value increased by 50% (from 0.431 to 0.647), which places it above the average for other South Asian countries (0.642).
- However, for inequality-adjusted HDI (IHDI), India's position drops by one position to 130, losing nearly half the progress (.647 to .477) made in the past 30 years.

Gender Inequality Index (GII):

- GII presents a composite measure of gender inequality using three dimensions:
- Reproductive health
- Empowerment and
- The labour market
- In the Gender Inequality Index (GII), India is at 122 out of 162 countries.
- Neighboring countries China (39), Sri Lanka (86), Bhutan (99), Myanmar (106) are above India.
- The world is not on track to achieve gender equality by 2030 as per the UN's Sustainable Development Goals. It may take 202 years to close the gender gap in economic opportunity — one of the three indicators of the GII.

- Global Gender Gap Report 2020
- The Global Gender Gap Index is a framework for capturing the magnitude of gender-based disparities and tracking their progress over time.
- It was first introduced by the World Economic Forum in 2006.
- India has been ranked 112th among 153 countries in the annual Global Gender Gap Index for 2020. In 2018 India's rank was 108.



Parameters of the Index:

- The Global Gender Gap Index benchmarks 153 countries on their progress towards gender parity in four dimensions:
- Economic Participation and Opportunity,
- Educational Attainment,
- Health and Survival and
- Political Empowerment
- Over the Index, the highest possible score is 1 (equality) and the lowest possible score is 0 (inequality).

Key findings:

- Globally, the average (population-weighted) distance completed to parity is at 68.6%, which is a further improvement since last edition.
- At current pace, it will take 99.5 years to achieve full parity between men and women.
- The largest gender disparity is in political empowerment. Only 25% of the 35,127 seats in parliaments around the world are occupied by women, and only 21% of the 3,343 ministers are women.
- Iceland is once again the most gender-equal country in the world for the 11th time in a row. It has closed almost 88% of its overall gender gap, further improving since last year.
- Iceland is followed by Nordic neighbors Norway (2nd, 84.2%), Finland (3rd, 83.2%) and Sweden (4th, 82.0%).
- Yemen is ranked the worst (153rd), while Iraq is 152nd and Pakistan 151st.
- India is far behind other countries like China (106th), Sri Lanka (102nd), Nepal (101st), Brazil (92nd), Indonesia (85th) and Bangladesh (50th).

- As per WHO the global decrease in case numbers is due to large-scale vaccination campaigns.
- It is noteworthy that in 2017, WHO formulated "Global Roadmap to 2030 strategy" for effective prevention of cholera.
- The Global Roadmap aims to reduce cholera deaths by 90% and to eliminate transmission in up to 20 countries by 2030.

- On 4 December 2019, the Global Climate Risk Index,
 2020 was released by the international environmental think tank Germanwatch.
- This is the 15th edition of this index.
- The index analyses the extent to which countries and regions have been affected by the impacts of weather-related loss events (storms, floods, heat waves etc.).
- The countries and territories affected most in 2018 were Japan, the Philippines as well as Germany.
- For the period from 1999 to 2018(long-term index) Puerto Rico, Myanmar and Haiti rank highest.
- Altogether, about 495 000 people died as a direct result of more than 12 000 extreme weather events globally and losses between 1999 and 2018 amounted to around US\$ 3.54 trillion (in purchasing power parities).
- Heatwaves were one major cause of damage in 2018. Of the ten most affected countries in 2018, Germany, Japan and India were suffering from extended periods of heat.
- Of the ten most affected countries and territories in the period 1999 to 2018, seven
 were developing countries in the low income or lower-middle income country group,
 two were classified as upper-middle income countries (Thailand and Dominica) and
 one was an advanced economy generating high income (Puerto Rico).

India specific findings:

- In the Climate Risk Index 2020, India is ranked 5th.
- Whereas in 2017 India's rank was 14th.
- India's high rank is due to severe rainfalls, followed by heavy flooding and landslide that killed over 1000 people.
- India has also recorded the highest number of fatalities due to climate change and the second-highest monetary losses from its impact in 2018.

THE SIPRI TOP 100 ARMS PRODUCING AND MILITARY SERVICES COMPANIES, 2018

Question: As per report by Stockholm International Peace Research Institute (SIPRI) how much of sale of arms and military services was done by the sector's largest 100 companies?

- On 9 December 2019, Stockholm International Peace Research Institute (SIPRI) released its report on Global arms industry rankings.
- As per report, Sales of arms and military services by the sector's largest 100 companies (excluding those in China) totaled \$420 billion in 2018, marking an

increase of 4.6 per cent compared with the previous year.



- The database excludes Chinese companies due to the lack of data to make a reliable estimate.
- Global Arms industry ranking highlights that eighty of the 100 top arms producers in 2018 were based in the USA, Europe and Russia. Of the remaining 20, 6 were based in Japan, 3 in Israel, India and South Korea, respectively, 2 in Turkey and 1 each in Australia, Canada and Singapore.

United States-The Dominator:

- The report figures that total arms sales of US companies in the ranking amounted to \$246 billion, equivalent to 59 per cent of all arms sales by the Top 100. This is an increase of 7.2 per cent compared with 2017.
- For the first time since 2002, the top five spots in the ranking are held exclusively by arms companies based in the United States: Lockheed Martin, Boeing, Northrop Grumman, Raytheon and General Dynamics.
- Russia appeared second on the list of arms production while the UK was third in the rankings with 8.6 percent and 8.4 percent of shares respectively.

India Specific Findings:

- The combined arms sales of the three Indian arms companies listed in the Top 100 were \$5.9 billion in 2018—a decrease of 6.9 per cent on 2017.
- The decline is mainly a result of Indian Ordnance Factory's significant 27 per cent drop in arms sales.
- In the Top-100 arms-producing and military services companies rankings, India's Hindustan Aeronautics was ranked 38th with arms sale of USD 2740 mn in 2018.
- Among other two Indian companies in Top-100, Indian Ordnance Factories is ranked 56th and Bharat Electronics is at 62nd spot.

- The monetary policy committee said that the global economic activity has subdued since its last meeting.
- Among the other emerging markets, growth of China has decelerated in the Q3 and its exports have declined greatly mainly due to trade tensions with the US.
- The GDP growth of Russia and Brazil in the Q3 has accelerated. It was mainly due to agricultural output and industrial activities.
- Sixth bimonthly policy for financial year 2019-20 will be released on February 6, 2020.

- Indian commodities whose exports to the US have increased due to trade diversion effect mainly include chemicals, metals and ores, electrical machinery, agro-food, furniture, etc.
- At the time of trade war with US, China was about \$21billion in the first half of 2019 which indicates its trade loss about 14million dollar.



• The traffic against them made the other investors more competitive in the US market that leads to the trade diversion effect.


Russia inducts first Avangard hypersonic missiles into service

- On 27 December 2019, Russia inducted first Avangard hypersonic missiles into service.
- Avangard is also known as Objekt 4202, Yu-71, and Yu-74. It is a Russian hypersonic glide vehicle that can be carried as a MIRV payload by the UR-100UTTKh,



- The Avangard has a range of over 6,000 km, weighs approximately 2,000 kg, and can deliver both nuclear and conventional payloads.
- This intercontinental hypersonic weapon can fly 27 times the speed of sound and is capable of sharp manoeuvres in the atmosphere en route to target making it much harder to intercept.
- The Avangard can carry a nuclear weapon of up to 2 megatons.
- Avangard is designed using new composite materials to withstand temperatures of up to 2,000 Celsius resulting from a flight through the atmosphere at hypersonic speeds.

MIRV:

 A multiple independently targetable reentry vehicle (MIRV) is a missile payload containing several warheads, each capable of being aimed to hit a different target.

Hypersonic Cruise Missiles:

- HypersonicCruise Missiles travel at a speed of more than 5 Mach.Many countries are working to develop Hypersonic Cruise Missiles.
- BrahMos Aerospace is also in the process of developing a hypersonic cruise missile, BRAHMOS II, which wouldfly at a speed greater than 5 Mach.

- During the test, the missile was gravity dropped from the air combat platform's
 fuselage and the two-stage weapon's engine fired up and the missile straightaway
 propelled towards the intended target positioned at the sea, piercing it with pin
 point accuracy.
- Earlier on May 22, 2019, IAF had successfully tested the missile against a land-based target in the Car Nicobar Islands region. The BrahMos Air Launched Cruise Missile (ALCM) promises to bolster the air combat capability of IAF from stand-off ranges.



PSLV-C48 lifted-off at 15:25 Hrs (IST) and after 16 minutes and 23 seconds, was

successfully injected into an orbit of 576 km.

Subsequently, nine commercial satellites
were injected into their intended orbits.
After separation, the two solar arrays of
RISAT-2BR1 were deployed automatically
and the ISRO Telemetry Tracking and
Command Network at Bengaluru assumed
control of the satellite.



- RISAT-2BR1 is radar imaging earth observation satellite weighing about 628 kg.
- The satellite will provide services in the field of Agriculture, Forestry and Disaster Management. The mission life of RISAT-2BR1 is 5 years.
- The nine customer satellites of Israel, Italy, Japan and USA were precisely injected into their designated orbits. These satellites were launched under a commercial arrangement with NewSpace India Limited (NSIL).
- PSLV-C48 is the **2nd flight of PSLV in 'QL' configuration** (with 4 solid strap-on motors).
- Besides being the 50th launch of PSLV, today's launch was also the 75thlaunch vehicle mission from SDSC SHAR, Sriharikota.

- They further stated that the progress on the pre-2020 agenda will be the benchmark of success for this COP. The Paris Agreement, adopted under the United Nations Framework Convention on Climate Change, represents a key

milestone in the progressive development of multilateralism to enable the international community to collectively address climate change, which is of pressing global concern.

Ministers underlined that COP25 should achieve outcomes as follows:

- To conclude the negotiations related to article 6 of the Paris Agreement.
- To mandate a 2-year Work Programme under SBI to assess the pre-2020 progress and gaps, with a view to making the necessary arrangements to fill those gaps.
- To urge developed country Parties to fulfill their commitments on providing finance, technology development and transfer and capacitybuilding support to developing countries.
- To interpret and implement the provisions of the Paris Agreement in a holistic and faithful manner.
- Recalling that the Paris Agreement represents a delicate political balance negotiated amongst 195 Parties with diverse levels of development and distinct national circumstances, the Ministers expressed grave concern regarding the current imbalance in the negotiations.
- Commitments made by developed countries in the pre-2020 period must be honoured, because the completion of the pre-2020
 Agenda is of critical importance in building the basis for mutual trust and ambition in the post-2020 period.
- The pre-2020 gaps with regard to mitigation, adaptation, means of implementation and reporting by developed countries must be assessed and closed, without transferring any burden to developing countries.

WADA bans Russia from international sporting events for four years

Question: World Anti-Doping Agency, WADA has banned which country from international sporting events for four years?

- On 9th December 2019, the World Anti-Doping Agency, WADA, banned Russia from global sporting events for four years at its meeting in Lausanne, Switzerland.
- Under the ruling, Russia will not be allowed to participate in international competition, which includes the 2020 Tokyo Olympics and the 2022 Beijing Winter Olympics, Youth Olympic Games, Paralympics, FIFA's World Cup, world championships and other major sporting events subject to WADA code.
- WADA spokesman James Fitzgerald stated that the 12-member WADA's executive committee unanimously approved to assert non-compliance on the Russian antidoping agency for accused state-sponsored system of doping.
- Apart from this, the ruling means Russian athletes will still be allowed to compete at the Tokyo Olympics as neutrals, but only if they can demonstrate that they were not part of what WADA believes was a state-sponsored system of doping.
- Fitzgerald said that participants will have to prove that they were not involved in the doping schemes as described by the McLaren report, or they did not have their samples affected by the manipulation.
- The independent McLaren report released in 2016 revealed the significant extent of state-sponsored doping in Russia, notably between 2011 and 2015.



- The project will upgrade 750 km of state highways and 850 km of MDRs to two-lane and all-weather standards with road safety features. It will also develop an e-maintenance system, which can record defects or required maintenance, along with a training program to develop capacity on contract implementation and project finance in the Madhya Pradesh Road Development Corporation.
- Since 2002, ADB has provided the state government with five loans to develop its road network, improving about 7,300 km of roads or about 11% of the total network.


